'Over the Rainbow' was voted the No. 1 song of the 20th century in a 2007 poll of the music industry. It comes from the American film *The Wizard of Oz*, released in 1939. Early in the film, young Dorothy fled up with her cat and a dog to a farmhouse in a faraway land 'somewhere over the rainbow' (the words sang to the first line of the melody). Dorothy is carried off by a tornado to the land of Oz, where she encounters witches, a wizard and other magical creatures. The song was written for the film by the established team of lyricist E. Y. ('Yip') Harburg and composer Harold Arlen, which won Academy Award (Oscar) for the film. All rights reserved. International copyright secured.
